Founded in 1992 this core mission began when one person, responding to Christ's call and the urging of the Holy Spirit, decided to help one other person through sponsorship. It continues today because others joined in that mission. They began in Canada in 1996 as Christian Child Care International and changed their name to Chalice in January 2008. Today their main administration continues in Bedford, Nova Scotia. In July of 2017 they expanded their mission to the United States and opened the office of Chalice US in Chicago.

Chalice is a Catholic international aid charity focused on child, family, and community development. They work closely with lay people, religious missionaries, and local communities to provide care for the many children and families caught in the dehumanizing grip of poverty.

Since its inception, Chalice has been restoring hope and dignity to people in developing countries through our sponsorship program. Children and elders are selected for sponsorship based on need and family circumstances, regardless of race, age, ability, gender, or religion.

Each of their 53 sponsor sites, spanning across 14 developing countries, is under local direction. By working closely with those who live and experience the difficulties of poverty, they gain knowledge and insight on how to best respond to challenges. They assist religious and lay partner organizations in caring for impoverished children, the homeless, sick, infirmed, and aged by providing health, education, shelter, water, and nutritional benefits. They assist in the construction, repair or expansion of schools, clinics, hospitals, orphanages, homes and other constructions that benefit the financially poor.

Mission Statement: To reveal God's love in action by serving the poor, with the Global Catholic Community.

<u>Values:</u> Founded in Christ and dedicated to the love of Mary, Mother of the Church, we believe that every person has a basic and equal right to dignity.

Writing:

- Ensure your sponsor friend's name and Code is clearly visible Cristina's child code TON3766
- Be short and simple. All letters need to be translated.
- Be personal. Write about your family, children, pets etc.
- Sponsor children/aged is very grateful and happy when they receive photos of their sponsors.
- You are also able to send photos of yourself and/or your family. Sponsor children/aged are very grateful and happy when they receive photos of their sponsors.
- Be humble. Do not mention trips, purchases, or other events that are costly and beyond the reach of your friend.
- Please bring letters and greeting to the parish office, and include the child code on your letter. The letter should not contain contact information such as your address, phone number or email address. Chalice will shred the outer envelope that your letter arrives in to ensure your privacy(as per Chalice's guidelines) and we mail the correspondence to your child with our regular packages to the sites.
- Be patient! It can take up to 6 months to receive a response to your letter due to the administrative process and delivery complications. Letters will come to our Parish.
